### **About PGA TOUR Champions**

PGA TOUR Champions is a membership organization of professional golfers age 50 and older, including 35 members of the World Golf Hall of Fame. The Tour's mission is to provide financial opportunities for its players, entertain and inspire its fans, deliver substantial value to its partners, create outlets for volunteers to give back and generate significant charitable and economic impact in tournament communities. All events are televised in the United States on Golf Channel, the exclusive cable-television partner of PGA TOUR Champions. Internationally, PGA TOUR Champions coverage is available in more than 170 countries and territories via 20 broadcast partners.

### **Charity**

Each PGA TOUR tournament provides individuals an opportunity to give back to the community in one of three ways – attending an event, volunteering, or donating money. Virtually all tournaments are organized as non-profit organizations to maximize charitable giving, and to date, tournaments across all Tours have generated more than \$4 billion. The charitable total includes donations made by tournaments on the PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions, Korn Ferry Tour, and PGA TOUR Americas.

### **2026 Schedule**

Featuring 28 events (25 regular season and three playoff events), the regular season will welcome two new tournaments – the Portugal Invitational in Algarve, Portugal (July 27-August 2) and the Jefferson Lehigh Valley Classic in Allentown, Pennsylvania (September 28-October 4). In total, Champions Tour golfers will visit 18 states and four other countries (Morocco, Scotland, Portugal, Canada). The 2026 season will have players competing for more than \$70 million in total prize money, marking a Tour record.

### Charles Schwab Cup

The 25-event regular season will lead into the 10<sup>th</sup>-annual Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs, which begin at the Stifel Charity Classic in St. Louis, followed by the Simmons Bank Championship in Little Rock, Arkansas. The season will conclude with the Charles Schwab Cup Championship at Phoenix Country Club on Sunday, November 15, 2026.

At the start of the playoffs, each player's regular-season money total will become the equivalent number of points (e.g. \$300,000 equals 300,000 points). During the three Playoffs events, each dollar earned is worth two points, and those points will be added to a player's regular-season point total. The player with the most points at the conclusion of the Charles Schwab Cup Championship will win the season-long Charles Schwab Cup title.

The Charles Schwab Cup offers \$2.1 million in prize money to the top-five finishers at season's end. The prize money will be distributed in lump sum deposits into a Schwab brokerage account to be invested into a Schwab Managed Portfolio (SMP), if eligible. The winner of the season-long Charles Schwab Cup will be awarded \$1 million and the 2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> place finishers will receive prize money of \$500,000, \$300,000, \$200,000, and \$100,000, respectively.

### Rookies

For players to become eligible to compete for PGA TOUR Champions events they must turn 50 years of age by the first competition round. If a player plays less than six tournaments in his first season of eligibility, he is considered a rookie the following season. Players with at least one PGA TOUR career victory who will become eligible during the 2026 season include:
