Things to Know

- **Format:** The American Family Insurance Championship was played in a two-man team format. The winning team shared \$600,000 (\$300,000 per player) of the \$3 million purse.
 - **First Round:** Best Ball
 - **Second Round:** Scramble
 - **Final Round:** Best Ball

Darren Clarke/Ben Crane, 62-54-67 – 183 (-30)

- 57-year-old Clarke earned his sixth win on PGA TOUR Champions (160 starts).
 - Last win: 2025 American Family Insurance Championship (with partner Thomas Bjørn)
 - Note: Bjørn is recovering from spinal surgery and not in the 2026 field.
- Clarke earned his first win of the 2026 season (10 starts).
 - Previous best finish: T3 (Insperity Invitational)
 - Moves up to No. 10 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Clarke earned his second win at the American Family Insurance Championship (fifth appearance; second appearance as team event).
 - Previous win: 2025 (with partner Thomas Bjørn)
- Clarke becomes the second two-time winner of the American Family Insurance Championship, joining Jerry Kelly (2019, 2021).
 - Note: the American Family Insurance Championship was an individual event from 2016 to 2024.
- Clarke's position by round in the team era of the American Family Insurance Championship (chronologically): 1st-1st-Won-T6-1st-Won.
- Clarke achieves the second successful title defense of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Previous instance: Steven Alker (Cologuard Classic)
- Clarke improved to 5-for-7 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (4-for-6 in 54-hole events).
- 50-year-old Crane earned his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (eight starts).
 - The rookie turned 50 years old on March 6.
 - Previous best finish: 2nd (Senior PGA Championship)
- Crane snapped a winless streak of 11 years, 11 months, 30 days (or 4,382 days) dating back to the 2014 FedEx St. Jude Classic.
 - Note: the 2014 FedEx St. Jude Classic ended on June 8, 2014, one day shy of 12 years ago.
- Crane becomes the 25th player to win on the PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions and Korn Ferry Tour.

- Crane's wins by Tour: 5 wins (PGA TOUR), 1 win (PGA TOUR Champions), 2 wins (Korn Ferry Tour)
 - Previous instance: Zach Johnson (accomplished at the 2026 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational)
- Crane becomes the fourth first-time winner of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Previous instances: Zach Johnson (James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational), Boo Weekley (Insperity Invitational), Scott Hend (Trophy Hassan II)
- This marks the third consecutive event with a first-time winner on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Previous instance: Mike Weir (2021 Insperity Invitational), Alex Cejka (2021 Regions Tradition), Dicky Pride (2021 Mitsubishi Electric Classic)
 - Last two event winners entering this week: Boo Weekley (Insperity Invitational), Scott Hend (Trophy Hassan II)
- Crane improved to 1-for-1 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions.

Other Notes

- **Kenny Perry/George McNeill** carded the low round of the day (9-under 62 in Best Ball) en route to a runner-up finish at 29-under.
 - This is Perry's first top-2 finish on PGA TOUR Champions since the 2020 Charles Schwab Series at Bass Pro Shops Big Cedar Lodge (T2 – lost in playoff).
 - This is McNeill's second top-2 finish and fifth top-10 on PGA TOUR Champions (nine starts).
 - Previous instance: T2 (James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational)
 - Note: rookie McNeill turned 50 years old on October 2, 2025.
- The teams of **Rory Sabbatini/Brian Gay** and **Cameron Percy/Greg Chalmers** each finished T3 at 28-under.
- The duo of Charles Schwab Nos. 1 and 2 **Stewart Cink/Zach Johnson** were among the five teams that finished T5 at 27-under.
- Tournament host **Steve Stricker**, playing alongside **Mario Tiziani**, finished T17 at 23-under.
